
I am sure I missed a few, so my apologies. This Helping Hand Volunteer Day was a huge success and we are extremely grateful. Well done everyone!!!

In October, the carpet was replaced on the canteen side for just under \$24,000. Most of the cost was covered by a \$20,000 grant from Island County, leaving the Post paying for about \$4,000 and it was a well-spent investment as the last time we replaced the carpet was in the early 80s. As an added benefit, the Post smells much, much better and the slightly lighter color brightens up the room. We will begin putting up all the plagues after the holidays so the canteen staff can put up holiday decorations. Additionally, and we will be reorganizing the entrance to better to welcome you and your guests. We have also setup the POW/MIA table back where it used to be. If you have not dropped by recently, please do so soon and check out all the great work!. Hope you agree that our Post looks and smells much better.

We remain the second-largest Post in Washington State at 992 members. We ended the VFW-year (30 June) at 998, but after reconciling our numbers from death and non-payment of dues, we fell back to 945 starting 01 July. With 807 Life Members in our rolls, we are projected to end up at 992 provided our remaining 79 Continuous (Annual) Members remain with us. Our current retention is at 41.40%, so we should get back to 945 (100% membership). Over the past two years, we have lost 34 members and that is too excessive. If we work hard to communicate with every member of our Post, we should not lose anyone this year. We continue to bring into our ranks new and reinstated (welcome back) members, and so far our top recruiter is:

Quartermaster Keith Wooldridge at 22 - BZ Keith!!!

Our National President challenged every one of us to bring in (or back) one member into our ranks as Every Veteran Counts! I would love to see 50 members with at least one recruit as that would get us over 1000 members! I ask each of you to help bring in one recruit and more importantly, help mold them into a productive member of our Post. I asked Rob Armer to break down our membership by age so you have a better understanding of where our membership is:



As you can see above, our oldest member is 100 years old (Murdoch MacDonald currently living in Arizona), while our youngest members are both 23 years old (Jonel Veloso and Charles Messmer. The bulk of our membership is over 60 years old (603 members).

There were a number of Veterans Day celebrations last week including our Oak Harbor schools. Thank you for attending them. Last Saturday our awesome VFW Riders Group Chapter 1 held a Ringing of the Bell ceremony at the Post Memorial Garden. What a solemn ceremony where the names of our Fallen were read. Well done Comrades!!!




